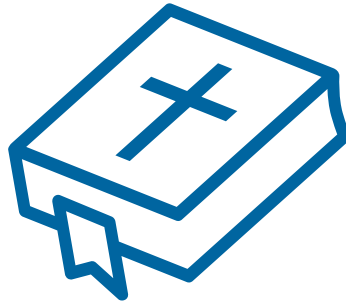

Have everyone sit as you open your Bible and read **1 John 3:1**:

“See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are!”

Now, I invite you to close your eyes and imagine your Heavenly Father embracing you or looking at you as His child. If you want, you can wrap your arms around yourself in a hug. Or, you can simply sit quietly.

Encourage the children to stay in this position as you speak the final blessing over them.

May you know that you're a child of God. May you experience His love when you feel sad, confused, or lost. May you remember your Father will always respond to you in love, for He is love.
